



Revisiting White Cross

White Cross giving has long been a favorite part of American Baptist Women's Ministries. A check sent from one of our Colorado churches to our State ABWM treasurer to disburse for "White Cross" reminds us that other AB women may be unclear about how to support White Cross now.

There are no longer requests sent to churches to support specific ministries, but these ministries still have needs. Now, it is up to us to decide where to send White Cross support. We need to go to appropriate websites to find information on our White Cross giving options and to guide our decisions.

For international projects, "Overseas White Cross," one can go to the International Ministries website, https://internationalministries.org. Across the top of the home page, find the Ways to Support menu bar, and under that click on White Cross. You can learn more about White Cross internationally there. You can click on **Find a Project** to learn about many specific projects. If you click on **Download Project List**, you will find 19 broadly defined areas of the world where there are many needs. There will be guidance there about various ways to give.

The tradition of "Overland White Cross", within the United States and Puerto Rico, is carried on by **Operation Planting Hope (OPH)**, under American Baptist Home Mission Societies (AHMS): https://abhms.org/ministries/healing-communities/ operation-planting-hope/. There you will learn which ministries (e.g. neighborhood centers, native American ministries, immigrant ministries, Rainbow Acres, etc.) are eligible for "white cross" support through OPH. Click on the name of any ministry listed to go to their website to learn more about what they do and how to give. Some of these websites may indicate what the ministry's needs are.

I am willing to help anyone wanting assistance in walking through either of these processes to learn how we can continue to support White Cross.

1. First time applicants and 2. Renewal applications.

The American Baptist Women Ministerial Grant Application is also on the website. The Ministerial Student Grant is to assist consecrated Christian women to further their education to prepare for ministerial leadership. Graduate students who are contemplating going into the ministry should consider applying for this grant.

Ladies let us give God all the praise and glory for being able to offer scholarships and grants to women who desire to further their education.

The Jane Loring Jones Scholarship

Description and Criteria

The American Baptist Women's Ministries of Colorado annually award the Jane Loring Jones Scholarships to young women who are members of ABCRM churches in Colorado, NM, and Utah.

- Women under the age of 26 on July 1 of the granting year, planning to attend an accredited college or university on a full-time basis (12 credit hours or more) and studying for an AA or BA/BS degree may apply.
- The selection process will consider the applicant's GPA, class standing, ACT/SAT scores, references, personal video, and activities.
- The scholarship is awarded annually, allocated and paid each academic period, and sent directly to the educational institution to be credited to the student's account. The scholarship applies to tuition, room and board, plus any additional institutional expenses.
- The scholarship provides \$4,000 to residential students attending non-American Baptist colleges and universities.
- The scholarship provides \$2,000 to non-residential students attending non-American Baptist colleges and universities.
- The scholarship provides \$4,000 to students attending American Baptist colleges and universities.

DEADLINE for the application is by the due date. Jane Loring Jones application is found on the ABCRM.org website.

Note: "Academic Period" includes a semester, trimester, quarter, or other period of study.
